She started her journey in adult education a few months after she had her first child. At the time, she was looking for a way to continue teaching part-time. She planned to work at Middletown Adult Education for a limited time, until she went back to "real" teaching. Twenty-one years later, she is still teaching at Middletown Adult Education and cannot think of a better job. She tells anyone who will listen that she has the best job in the world. Her current course of study is in the doctoral program at Grand Canyon University. She has chosen to base her dissertation on adult education graduates who complete CNA training programs. She wants to highlight the success stories and explore the experiences of the students after they graduate from adult education programs. Her hope is that doing research on the successes of the adult education population will open people's eyes to the important and rewarding work involved in adult education.

In the future, Cathleen hopes to continue working at Middletown Adult Education and use the information she has gained from her coursework to advocate for adult education students. She also hopes to do more research on the adult education population, as it is sadly underrepresented. Her goal is to give her students the tools they need to be successful after they graduate from adult education, whether it is going on to postsecondary education, vocational training, the military, or the workforce. This course of study has given her insight into how to write grants, plan a budget, create learning plans for diverse situations, engage in multi-departmental planning, and work with multiple agencies to advocate for her students.
