

## Proclamation

WHEREAS, approximately 9 percent of the population ages 25 and over lack a high school diploma or the equivalent, experience literacy issues that impair their lives and families, their ability to work productively, and their full participation as citizens and residents; and WHEREAS, Adult education leads to higher earnings and self-sufficiency, and helps reduce the number of people living in poverty; and

WHEREAS, Arizona adult education provides a bridge to successful postsecondary

education and family sustaining careers for adult learners; and

WHEREAS, Adult education provides opportunities for individuals to build basic skills, prepare to enter the workforce, and earn industry-recognized training and credentials; and WHEREAS, Arizona's adult education system plays a critical role in our workforce system and is contributing to Arizona's Achieve60AZ goal that 60% of adults ages 25 to 64 will hold a postsecondary credential or degree by 2030; and

WHEREAS, Arizona's adult education providers supply over 800,000 hours of instruction annually to improve the literacy of Arizona's adults, including the digital literacy and

employment skills needed to succeed in the workplace; and

WHEREAS, Arizona Adult Literacy week will promote literacy and lifelong learning across our great State.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim March 12 - 18, 2023, as
