Whereas, more than 43 million adults in the United States cannot read, write, or do math above a third-grade level;

Whereas, low literacy and English language proficiency are often barriers to employment and community engagement for many Utahns;

##JETEAS, the greatest determinant of a child's school readiness and later achievement, over factors such as neighborhood and family income, is their primary caretaker's own reading skill;

Whereas, research has shown that bringing literacy skills up to the equivalent of a sixthgrade reading level across the country would generate an additional \$2.2 trillion a year for the U.S. economy;

Whereas, adult education programs contribute to solving these challenges by helping learners move along the continuum in their educational and career pathways with low-cost, high-value programs;
