Eligibility

Current adult learners who are enrolled in an adult education program: Adult Basic Education (ABE), Adult Secondary Education (ASE), High School equivalency (HSE), English as a Second Language (ESL), digital skills, and workforce readiness skills delivered by a COABE-affiliated local program.

Application Questions

In addition to basic demographic and contact information, learners will be asked to check a box asking if they were referred by their state association. They will also need to include their program name and location and the contact information from someone at their program.

Learners will also be asked to share:

- Why leadership matters to them
- How the Summit will help them grow
- How they plan to use what you learn to support others

How to Apply

Learners must submit their application by November 30, 2024 to be considered for one of the 2 guaranteed spots per state. Starting December 1st, the application will open widely and the reserved 2 spots for state will no longer apply.
